Under Vermont's Act 120, products sold in Vermont must contain a clear and conspicuous declaration that foods are: "produced with genetic engineering" ("GE") unless those selling, manufacturing or importing the foods into Vermont can prove otherwise. Some categories of foods and businesses are exempted from the labeling requirements. The following categories are exempt from the labeling requirements:

- meat or milk from animals fed GE feed;
- USDA-approved products;

Therefore, our USDA approved meat & poultry products are exempt from the labeling requirements of the Vermont Act 120 legislation.
