

## Soy sourcing data

Cargill is committed to creating sustainable supply chains in support of our purpose to nourish the world in a safe, responsible and sustainable way. We operate at the intersection of agriculture and business, connecting farmers to consumers around the world to ensure both sustainability values and agricultural development simultaneously thrive. The work of the Soft Commodities Forum complements Cargill's commitments that are outlined in our <u>Policy on Sustainable</u> <u>Soy from South American Origins</u> and our <u>South American Soy Action Plan</u>.

In the 25 priority municipalities, Cargill sources more than 96% directly from farmers, allowing us to have more transparency into our supply chain. We have reached 61% of traceability to the farm level allowing us to gather insights that enable positive transformation in our supply chains. By December 2020, we will complete single-point location mapping for 100% of direct suppliers (non-financed) in MATOPIBA, Amazon, Mato Grosso (BR163 and West) and those adjacent to protected areas. The Soft Commodities Forum (SCF) is a global platform for leading soft commodities companies, convened by the World Business Council for Sustainable Development (WBCSD) for the purpose of advancing collective action around common sustainability challenges.
