Re: CPG Hides – SDS Exemption Statement

To whom it may concern,

The cured and uncured hides produced by Cargill Protein Group (CGP) are exempt from the SDS requirement based on an evaluation of this product from an occupational exposure risk and deemed to be no different than ordinary end consumer use. If occupational exposure risks are identified, where an employee is subjected to physical or health hazards such as flammability/explosion hazard, inhalation, absorption, ingestion, or skin contact hazards, an SDS will be required.

Please note that the cured hides were soaked into a saturated salt (sodium chloride) brine. Sodium chloride (CAS No. 7647-14-5) is not regulated under: OSHA Hazard Communication Standard 29 CFR 1910.1200 or SARA Title III Does not contain any hazardous components. However, if brine is ingested, or had contact with skin and/or eyes, we recommend reviewing the SDS for sodium chloride available at: <https://www.cargill.com/doc/1432076030859/cg90-sds.pdf>.
